

I did however find a message from Bishop Barron that rings so true this year. I want to share it with you. Enjoy Bishop Barron's words as they are so powerful and strong. I wish each of you and your families a most wonderful and joyous Easter.

From the Bishop:


In the midst of extraordinary suffering, we celebrate the feast, *par excellence*, of life, of hope, of resurrection. Wouldn't it be better to postpone until our situation looks a tad brighter?

No — because it is precisely now when the meaning of Easter shines forth most clearly. At the very heart of Christian faith is the conviction that the Father sent the Son into our human condition — which means into matter, finitude, sickness and fear. The downward journey of the Son of God, even to the very limits of god for sakenness, is the richest possible expression of God's solidarity with every one of us who suffers. Into all the dark corners of our human experience, God's mercy has come.

But the work of God did not end with the cross. Christ's resurrection three days later proves that God's love is more powerful than anything that is in the world. This is why Christians have, from the beginning, held up the cross — the most terrifying symbol in antiquity — as a kind of taunt. "You think that scares us? God's grace is more powerful!"

And so today, we may ask: What can I do, right here and right now, to embody the divine love and provide hope? We can imitate Christ by going precisely to the darkest places — all the way down to the lonely, the abandoned, the fearful, the sick, to those who feel most alienated from God. To all of these people, we declare the victory of Jesus' resurrection.

Therefore, look around! Today, there seems to be darkness and suffering everywhere. That just means plenty of opportunities to love.



Supreme Secretary Patrick T. Mason was elected to the Board of Directors in 2017, after serving as State Deputy of New Mexico (2016-2018). Patrick joined the Supreme Council staff in September 2020 as an Assistant Supreme Secretary. He is a member of the Osage Nation, a Midwestern Native American tribe of the Great Plains. Prior to his work at the Supreme Council, Patrick worked full-time as a partner at the law firm of Mason & Isaacson, and represented the Little Sisters of the Poor, the Missionaries of Charity, the Diocese of Gallup and the Navajo Nation. Patrick earned degrees from Thomas Aquinas College and the University of New Mexico School of Law. Patrick and his wife, Rachel, are the parents of five young children and recently moved to Connecticut from Gallup, New Mexico.

In addition, Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly announced that he named Anthony V. Minopoli as Chief Operating Officer. Tony joined the Supreme Council staff as Senior Vice President in 2005 and has led the Investment Department since 2007. In 2015, he was promoted to Executive Vice President & Chief Investment Officer and, in 2018, he was elected to the Board of Directors. 
Celebrate the Year of St. Joseph

Consider utilizing these resources throughout the Year of St. Joseph and especially in preparation for the Solemnity of St. Joseph on March 19 and the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker on May 1.

CONSECRATION TO ST. JOSEPH

To help men live out the joy of Christ, and to provide all members of the parish community with examples of virtue, prudence and fatherhood, knights are encouraged to lead their communities in a consecration to St. Joseph during this year of St. Joseph. By this act of consecration, we ask for the aid and intercession of the foster father of Jesus Christ, St. Joseph, who serves as a true model for every man. Preparing for the Consecration to St. Joseph is not a single event, it is choosing a way of life for oneself. Through this act, each participant consciously chooses to be a beacon of God's love, authentic masculinity, and to hold himself and his brothers to the standard established by St. Joseph, Chaste Protector of the Virgin, Defender of the Universal Church and Terror of Demons.

This consecration can be done by an individual, a family, a council, or an entire parish community. It is important to make spiritual preparations leading up to the consecration by learning more about St. Joseph and praying for his intercession regularly. 

Passing along some great news to encourage you. Curt might have passed this along but thought I'd follow up.

Praying and holding a sign this morning and seeking to speak with the women at PP had great affect today.

Diane and I had been there for about half an hour when a young Hispanic woman came out of PP abortion building and was heading to her car. I waved to her and she acknowledged me. I waved her over and she excitedly came over. In her hand was a photo of the ultrasound (this is highly unusual) she had just received at PP and she ecstatically proclaimed, "I'm keeping my baby, see here, this is my baby" pointing to the tiny image. As best I could understand (I do not speak Spanish) she said the signs she saw being held made an impact. Obviously, God was working in her heart. She courageously cancelled her abortion and left PP! She was all alone... but not quite. We truly believe God knew and was convicting her and giving her the faith and courage to say yes to the little life inside her. She gave each of us a big hug and left. We were praising the LORD!

Pray for Valerie that she truly comes to know how much Jesus loves her and wants her to trust in him for her salvation and for her to continue to choose life for her baby. Pray her family and friends would rejoice with her and give her the help she needs. We tried to direct her to PDL for any help she might need but she was too excited and wanted to go home.

God hears our collective prayers. There were many folks holding signs and praying before we arrived. Even though they left before this all happened, they need to know the impact they had. We fortunately had the privilege to share in Valerie's joy directly!






