Supreme Chaplain's Monthly Challenge

JUNE 2021

“To what shall we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable can we use for it? It is like a mustard seed that, when it is sown in the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on the earth. But once it is sown, it springs up and becomes the largest of plants and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the sky can dwell in its shade.” (Gospel for June 13, Mk 4:30-32)

Every gardener has witnessed how great things can come from small beginnings. Planted in its proper season and cared for over time, the tiniest seed can blossom into a glorious plant. Parents, teachers and mentors responsible for the moral and spiritual formation of children know well the value of “planting seeds.” Instructing children in virtue at a young age gives them a firm foundation of faith as they mature. May we be intentional in our instruction and example to our children and others, knowing small actions can have great influence.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month, I challenge you to share your faith and beliefs in at least one conversation with your children or friends. Second, I challenge you to join with your brother Knights in planning and participating in the Faith in Action Family Prayer Night program or Holy Hour program.

Questions for Reflection:

What “seeds” of faith did your own parents or others plant in your life as a youth that blossomed later in life? What are some of the concrete ways (even small ways) you can share your faith with your family and friends? What role does your witness — attending Mass, going to confession, serving others and being willing to discuss your faith — play in helping to strengthen the faith of others?

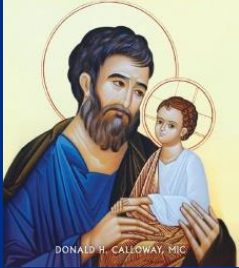
Moving the Felician Sisters

The Felician Sisters of North America lost their Rio Rancho convent in the middle of the pandemic. The Knights moved the Nuns into their new home.

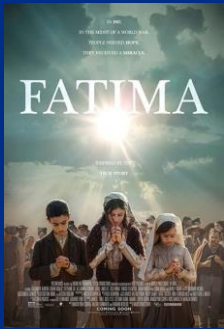

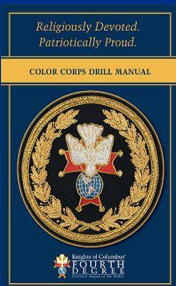

Somewhere in The Middle

“Children, it is the last hour; and just as you heard that the antichrist was coming, so now many antichrists have appeared. Thus, we know this is the last hour. They went out from us, but they were not really of our number; if they had been they would have remained with us. Their desertion shows that none of them was of our number”.

1 John 2:18-19

In his speech recently Tyler Perry was accepting the Jean Hersholt Humanitarian Award at the 93rd Oscars and he used the opportunity to ‘refuse hate’. He talked about his upbringing in the Jim Crow south, growing up poor, and his mother who taught him to reject blanket judgement and reject hate, and later his days as homeless. He talks about his mother grieving over watching other children around her murdered simply for the color of their skin. I have to believe that his mother’s words stayed with him because listening to him it is obvious the lesson he learned was that all that violence was born of hate, and so he chooses to “refuse hate”.

Tyler Perry challenges us to refuse hate, Jesus commands us to love one another.

It’s the same message.

Tyler finished his speech by talking about meeting in the middle. He talked about the middle is where listening is, where the healing is, where listening is, where conversation is, where listening is, where people can come together to find common ground, where listening is, away from the anger and shouting on the far left and far right, (I added the extra “where listening is” because it is important). He challenged anybody who chooses to refuse hate to meet him in the middle.

And so, where is the Church in all this? I was listening to Teresa Tomeo a while back and she was talking to a priest who was talking about a question he had been asked by a secular reporter: “Is the Church conservative, or liberal?” Teresa’s immediate answer was “the Church is the Church”! And while that is the exact correct answer it bears some deeper conversation. The Church does not have two separate teachings; the Church’s teaching is not dynamic and changing with the moral social interpretation of any given time. The teachings of the church are static and consistent, that form for us a moral standard that we should use to judge everything around us.

But I would say that on the one hand the Church could look very conservative, and on the other, very progressive and both would be true.

The Church's stand on abortion and euthanasia, on the moral teachings on homosexuality and transgender are, by every measure, very conservative.

On the other hand, the Church's work in Catholic Charities and Catholic Health Care would look, by most standards, to be very progressive, and this places the Church in the middle, exactly where it should be.

I have been very blessed to work in Catholic Health Care for the last 10 ½ years and to see first-hand how the conservative teachings of right to life of the Church is practiced in how we care for everyone around us, for the poor, the disadvantaged, and the underserved. In a way, the concrete values of the Church drive the progressive practices of the Church. It's a very difficult concept to understand if you're on the edges refusing to meet in the middle.

My brothers, there is a cancer in the Church today. That cancer is the voices of those administrators in the Church, and secular forces outside the Church who stand on the edges of the Church, and who are seeking to tear the Church apart. I wonder if those are the antichrists John is referring to.

To attempt to address any one of those issues individually only serves to put a band-aid on the symptom of the cancer. If we cure the cancer the symptoms will go away.

I believe the cure for the cancer is in the middle, where the listening is, where the healing is, where love is, where the conversation is, where we see the face of Jesus in everyone around us, where we accept Tyler Perry's challenge to reject hate and where we live Jesus's command to love one another.

My brothers, we are called to cure the cancer, we are called to meet in the middle and spread the healing teachings of Jesus and the Church. My brothers, we are called to Evangelize from the middle.
