

Advent comes from the Latin word meaning "coming." Jesus is coming, and Advent is intended to be a season of preparation for His arrival. While we typically regard Advent as a joyous season, it is also intended to be a period of preparation, much like Lent. Prayer, penance and fasting are appropriate during this season.

Advent is not as strict as Lent, and there are no rules for fasting, but it is meant to be a period of self-preparation. The purple color associated with Advent is also the color of penance. The faithful should fast during the first two weeks in particular and receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

The color of the Third Sunday of Advent is rose. This color symbolizes joy and represents the happiness we will experience when Jesus comes again. The Third Sunday is a day of anticipatory celebration. It is formerly called "Gaudete" Sunday; gaudete means "rejoice" in Latin.

Finally, Sundays during Advent, just as during Lent, should not be given to fasting, but instead to celebration because we celebrate the resurrection of Our Lord every Sunday. It is important to remember, however, there are no particular rules for how the laity should observe Advent.

Advent 2021 begins on Sunday, November 28 and ends on Thursday, December 24.



Supreme Chaplain's Monthly Challenge

“Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury. For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood.” (Gospel for Nov. 7, Mk 12:43-44)


“Give until it hurts” might seem like a tired old cliché, but it has merit nonetheless. It’s fairly easy to give from our excess — what we don’t really need — but real sacrifice begins when we go beyond that. The widow in the parable, in giving what to many people would be a bit of loose change, offered a more meaningful gift than the wealthy who donated far larger sums they would hardly miss. But there’s another layer of meaning here: Unlike the wealthy, the widow gave everything she had to God and put her trust completely in his divine providence. May we recognize that she made the wiser investment.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month, I challenge you to review your charitable giving and to pray about whether God is asking you to contribute something more. Second, I challenge you to participate in your council’s Food for Families or Coats for Kids Faith in Action program.

Questions for Reflection:

How does God wish you to balance providing for yourself and your family with serving others? Do you find you put your trust in material goods and wealth, rather than in God? What are some specific, concrete ways you might do better at sharing your blessings with the less fortunate?



From Worthy Lecturer SK Jimm White

Lately I've been reading *The Screwtape Letters*, by C.S. Lewis. He was a professor in the 1940's in England, right in the heart of WW II. But more than that I think he was a prophet. So much of what the demon, Screwtape, says to his underling, Wormwood, would seem to be more true today than it was in his time. But if you understand the social undercurrent that goes back to Marx you understand what we see today is nothing new, it existed then as well.

Marx, and Engel's, in their *Communist Manifesto*, demands the total and complete destruction of society as we know it. The riots two summers ago, when BLM for example was destroying statues of Abraham Lincoln, seen through the lens of Marxist Socialism, shows us the riots were not about social justice, they were about the fulfillment of Marx's demand to completely destroy society and replace it with Socialism. We've seen it before, the Russian revolution of 1917, and the early years of Nazi Germany. History has recorded the results. Millions dead.

In his early writings before his manifesto, Marx clearly hates religion, ALL religion, but specifically Christianity, and even more specifically, the Catholic Church. Ironically his hatred of religion becomes a religion in its own rite, Socialism.

Marx understood that religion was the undercurrent of most all societies, and to destroy those societies he had to first destroy religion. Understanding this gives us a deeper understanding of the attacks on the Church, both from within, and without. Socialism must destroy God and Religion and replace it with the state.


In the face of this we ask, "what can we do to push back, it all seems too far gone". To destroy your enemy, you must first know your enemy. Our enemy is Satan, and his Screwtapes, his demons, are Marx and Alinski and their followers.

While the scandal's in the Church must be addressed, dealing with these without understanding the core problem is akin to putting out spot fires while the forest is burning down.

If Socialism's goal is to destroy religion, and the strength of religion is faith, prayer, and unity, then our tools to push back must be faith, prayer, and unity. Our faith in God and the teachings of his Son and our savior, Jesus Christ, must grow stronger, deeper, and more foundational in our daily lives. This means cutting through all the politics and all the noise and spending more quiet time in prayer, scriptures, and the sacraments. But you must know this, as you grow closer to God, your temptations to stop and let it all go, will grow stronger as well. It has been said, "the devil leaves you alone if you're already living in sin".

I believe in God and his promises, "Many are the troubles of the righteous, but the Lord delivers him from them all", Ps 34:20. I believe in Jesus Christ, I believe in the Catholic Church, not just the structures of men who are subject to their failings of faith, but the Church that Jesus founded on the Rock of Peter.

And I believe we will get through this because I believe in the promise that Jesus made: "And the gates of hell shall not prevail against it"
