SUPREME CHAPLAIN'S MONTHLY CHALLENGE

"You will be hated by all because of my name, but not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives." (Gospel for Nov. 16, Lk 21:17-19)



My Argument for Meeting in the Middle, v2.0

A few years after Pam and I were married I found myself sitting in a bar in Oshkosh, Wi. How I got there and why I was there is another story for another day. While sitting there with some of the folks from New Mexico Aviation Division, I was witness to something, that only until very recently, I had difficulty understanding.

As so often happens in bars, this one being a pilot's bar, strangers strike up conversations, and in this case, it was one of the men from our group, a retired US Air Force fighter pilot, who flew F4 Phantoms in Viet Nam, and a man with a strong Russian accent, who openly admitted that Russian fighter pilots had flown for North Viet Nam. He was later introduced as Victor Belinko. The same Victor Belinko who defected to a US Air Force Airbase in Japan on September 6th, 1976, with a Russian Mig 25 "Foxbat".

Victor was asked the standard question, "how do you like being in America?" He answered he has been treated well, much better than Russian propaganda ever said he would be, then, with a sheepish grin on his face, he made the comment he liked American women better that Russian women, because American women smelled better.

Then the conversation turned to what I still have trouble describing. These two fighter pilots realized that on one day, all those years ago in Viet Nam, the faced each other in a dog fight they both remembered very well. Neither could get the upper hand, and only fuel reserves ended that encounter. Both talked about the skill of the other, both said the other was the best fighter pilot they had ever flown against.

The years between Viet Nam and Oshkosh had passed, and barriers had been broken down. Now here they were in a bar in Oshkosh, drinking beer, telling stories, laughing with each other. As the night ended, I realized that what I had just witnessed was a bond between these two worriers that had been cemented in combat all those years ago in the skies over Viet Nam.

The irony of what I saw that night was strangely satisfying, but I didn't understand why, I couldn't describe how it felt. It wasn't until the last few weeks, after going back and reading one of my past reflections, that I came to understand that satisfaction.

It was my reflection from January, 2022, where I talked about Tyler Perry's challenge to all of us to come the middle, to break down the barriers, to listen, and to talk *with* each other, not *at* each other. It was after Charlie Kirks assignation I went back to re-read my comments about Tyler Perry, and suddenly I was able to put it all together.

These two men, who had tried so hard all those years before in Viet Nam to destroy the other, on that night in Oshkosh; these two men had come to the middle and talked. And when the night was over, they parted ways as friends. In this world today, there is good and there is evil. The Tyler Perry's and Charlie Kirks, the Knights of Columbus, the Catholic Church and so many other Christian, Jewish and God-fearing communities are examples of the good in this world.

The forces that hate all of these are the evil in this world.

It must seem obvious, but as these forces of good are growing, and they are, especially after Charlie's assignation, the forces of evil are becoming increasingly desperate. And it is important to understand this point because, I think, it gives a clearer understanding, a better perspective, of what we're seeing in our world today. The forces of good don't riot, they don't assassinate, they don't demonize, they don't hate.

And yet, these are the very tactics of the forces of evil. The forces of good seek to love God and our neighbors. The forces of good seek to unite in the middle to listen and to talk, and even if we don't always agree, seek to start that conversation and sew that seed.

The forces of evil seek at every turn to divide us, to pit us against each other, to hate others who don't agree with them, and if necessary, to stop the forces of good by any means available.

This is going to get louder, and in some cases, more violent. But we know that if we live in the forces of good, we will prevail. All through the Bible, Old Testament and New, God tells us he will always be with us. We know Jesus will not fail us. Paul tells us in his second letter to Timothy: "If we have died with Him, we will also live with Him; if we endure, we will also reign with Him."

As Knights, we are commanded in our very Exemplification to put on the Armor of God. This command echo's Paul's exhortation to the Ephesians 6:10-12 "Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms".














Breakfast Burritos





Color Guard Competition

It is time to prepare your Color Guards for the second competition this fraternal year! We are pleased to announce the First International Fourth Degree Color Guard Competition.

This competition will take place during the worldwide Catholic Patriot Day on **Tuesday**, **November 11**, **2025**. The objective is to highlight the Fourth Degree Color Guard's purpose of encouraging active Catholic citizenship and fostering the spirit of patriotism in members and the community at large

Participation Requirements:

- District Masters are to either hold a competition among their Assemblies' Color Guards or select their District's best Assembly Color Guard Team.
- Each District must submit one video, between three to five minutes in length, showcasing its Color Guard Team's skills.

Judging Criteria:

The judges will evaluate each video based on the Color Guard's performance, specifically assessing:

- Proper wearing of the Fourth-Degree uniform
- Proper carrying and posting of the National Colors, Papal Flag, and State or Province Flag
- Timing
- Movements
- Commands, both verbal and silent
- Proper sword control

All judging will be conducted strictly according to the instructions outlined in the **Supreme Drill Manual**.

Submission Details:

- The videos must be submitted to the Office of the Supreme Master at suprememaster@kofc.org.
- If the video file exceeds size limits, please upload the video to YouTube or other similar type of social media platforms and email the link to the address above.
- The submission deadline is November 28, 2025.

We will select the top five Color Guards in the Order and recognize their District Masters. The winning District Masters will receive a prize which will be announced soon.






