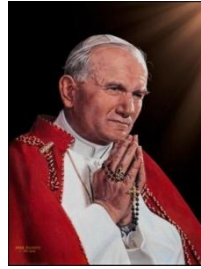

Supreme Chaplain's Monthly Challenge

September 2026

Then Peter approaching asked him, “Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive him? As many as seven times?” Jesus answered, “I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times.” (Gospel for Sept. 13, Mt 18:21-22)

To forgive others can be very difficult at times, especially when someone repeatedly offends us. Jesus tells us there is no magic number that limits our obligation — our desire to forgive and show mercy to others must be boundless, just as God’s mercy toward us is infinite. We pray in the Our Father, “Forgive us our trespasses *as we forgive those who trespass against us.*” Our very salvation depends on our willingness to forgive, for God will forgive us in the measure that we forgive others (cf. Mt 6:14-15).

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month, I challenge you to make a list of the people in your life — past and present — whom you find or have found difficult to forgive, and to sincerely pray for them each day.

Questions for Reflection:

Are there people in your life whom you find difficult to forgive for past offenses? Do you sometimes find yourself saying the words “I forgive you,” but holding on to the hurt like a grudge? What steps can you take to move to true forgiveness?

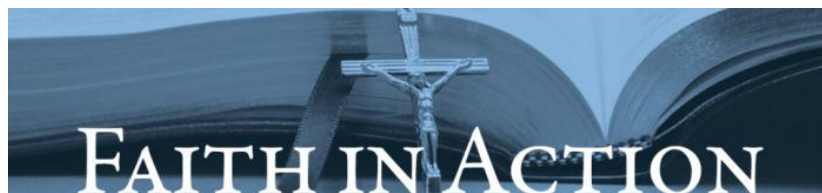

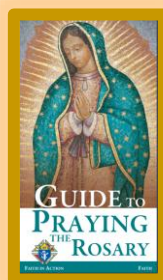

My Argument for the Responsibility of the Laity

In his book, “Reclaiming Vatican II”, Fr. Blake Britton talks about the theology of what happened at the foot of the cross and how John describes it:

“Standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother and his mother’s sister, Mary, the wife of Clopas, and Mary of Magdala. When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple there who he loved, he said to His mother, “Woman, behold your son”. Then he said to disciple, “Behold your mother”, and from that hour the disciple took her into his home.” Jn 19:25-27

Fr. Britton goes on to explain: “In this declaration, Christ expands the heart of his mother to enfold all of the faithful. Thus, Mary is not merely a member of the Church - she *is* the Church in person and as person”. This is why the Church is always referred to in the feminine.

This declaration also identifies *the* Church which, because it is of Christ and then Mary, is without sin; and the people, the faithful, of the *institution* of the Church, who are not without sin.

This is a symbiotic relationship, the church needs the people and the people needs the church.

Why is this important to the discussion of the laity and our responsibility to the Church?

Ever since Jesus said to Peter, “upon this rock I will build my Church, and the gates of Hell shall not prevail against it”, there have been two distinct groups of the faithful. One who wanted the Church to follow the norms of the day, thinking that would make the Church more in tune with what people wanted, and so there would be more Church followers; and those who understand *the* Church is the standard, the rock, that all the social norms need as guidance.

In our lifetimes this has become more apparent since Vatican II. There are those who wanted Vatican II to break down the walls of the Church to let the world in, to “modernize” the Church, so to speak. However, there are those who understood that the Church needed to break down the walls of the Church to let the Church out into the world, to mission to the world the gospel of Jesus. That is the path Vatican II took. But those progressive voices are still here.

Laity like Catherine of Siena, who challenged Pope Gregory XI and convinced him to move the Papacy back to Rome from Avignon, France. CCC 907 reads:

"In accord with the knowledge, competence, and preeminence which they possess, Lay people have the right and even at times a duty to manifest to the sacred pastors their opinion on matters which pertain to the good of the Church."

We are the Catholic faithful, the Catholic laity this speaks to. We are responsible to make known the truth of *the* Church to those pastors of the *institution* of the Church the errors of their ways, and in doing so, working to help to keep Jesus's promise, a promise he made knowing it would require the faithful to help to fulfill:

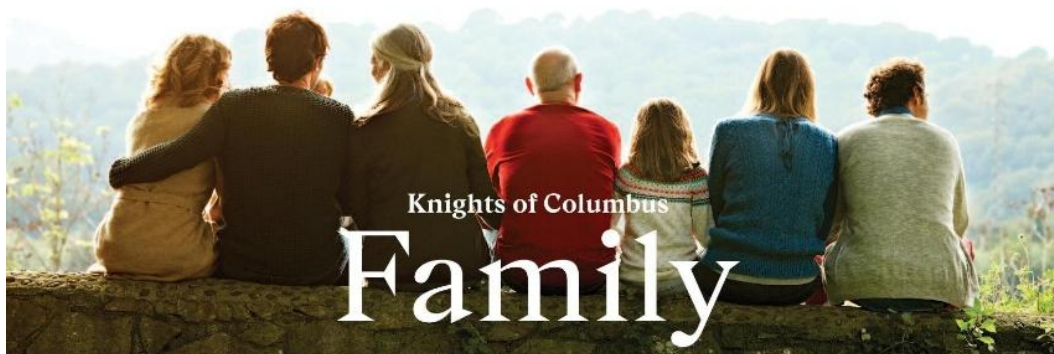

National Flag Etiquette

Since many of us are celebrating important milestones in our countries, it is an ideal time to review the mandatory protocols for handling and displaying the flag. As patriotic members of the Fourth Degree, maintaining the highest standards of flag etiquette is our distinct duty.

Please ensure the following rules are strictly observed across all assemblies and events:

1. The Position of Honor

- **The Flag's Right:** The right side is traditionally the place of honor (representing the historic sword arm). The union of the flag is always given the honor point: the marching right, the flag's own right, or an observer's left.
- **Sanctuary & Stage Placement:** In a public auditorium or chapel, the National Flag must stand in advance of the audience at the speaker's or chaplain's right as he faces the room. Any other flags must be placed to his left.

2. Proper Display & Decoration

- **Display Flat:** The flag should always be displayed flat. It must never be festooned over doorways, tied in a bowknot, or fashioned into a rosette.
- **Bunting:** Never drape the flag over a speaker's desk or platform front. Use patriotic bunting instead, arranged with blue on top, white in the middle, and red on the bottom.
- **No Alterations:** No lettering, figures, or objects of any kind may ever be placed on or attached to the National Flag.

3. Processions & Color Guard Protocol

- **Marching Order:** In a procession, the National Flag takes the marching right (the observer's left) or stands directly in front of the center of the flag line.
- **The No-Dip Rule:** When carried by a Knights of Columbus Color Guard, the National Flag will never be dipped by way of salute or compliment to any person or object.

4. Multiple National Flags

- When flags of two or more nations are displayed, they must be flown from separate staffs of the same height.

Thank you for your dedicated leadership and for preserving the dignity of our National Colors across the Order.

Proper Present Sword

At a recent honor guard at my Parish, we had 14 Sir Knights that came early in the week for an Honor Guard.

How thankful we were for so many to show during the week. Our brothers that attended were mostly retired, and mainly over the age of 70.

We practiced our entrance, recession, and escorting the gifts for 30 minutes prior to the mass.

After mass the deacon serving was a Fourth-Degree brother Knight and member of our assembly. I asked, "how did we look?"

His response was one I was waiting for, "You guys looked great, but your swords were everywhere"

When dealing with an honor guard of men who varied in age from the late 50's to the early 80's, how does the honor guard stay consistent?

Practice is certainly a top choice but also keeping in mind the strength of your members and knowing if any member may have lost the ability to hold a sword at attention for a long period of time. This would require the CCC, Marshal, or whoever is leading the honor guard to be sensitive to when you go to present, where you place your weaker members in line, and how long you wait before you line up. Let's be sensitive to our aging members who have given a lot of time, effort, and energy to the Fourth Degree, we want them to participate as long as they can, but to also make sure that we are presenting ourselves in the best possible way. Any other suggestions you have would be appreciated and shared.

Just to refresh all of us, here is the proper present sword for all honor guards.

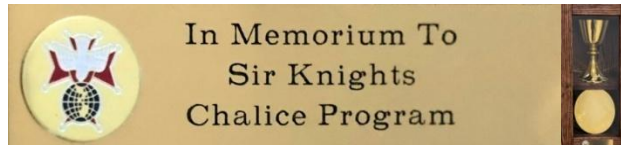

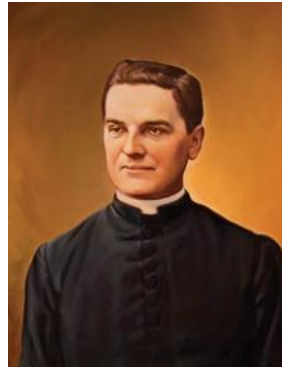
